Literacy

Ongoing Little Wandle Phonics and Reading Blend sounds into words, so that they can read short words made up of known letter—sound correspondences • Read some letter groups that each represent one sound and say sounds for them • Read simple phrases and sentences made up of words with known letter—sound correspondences and, where necessary, a few exception words. • Read a few common exception words matched to the school's phonic programme

Ongoing-Use print/letter knowledge in early writing. Write some letters accurately. Begin to write in continuous provision (more confident mark makers).

EAD

Children work together in ongoing opportunities to develop and create ideas- using songs, music, resources, drawings and pretend play
Ongoing use of artistic effects to express ideas and feelings. Art work linked to Superheroes.

Communication and Language
