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Introduction

As part of the plan for wider school reopening from September 2020, the government has published a guidance encouraging schools to promote active travel to and from schools.

"Schools should encourage parents, staff and pupils to walk or cycle to school if at all possible. Schools may want to consider using 'walking buses' (a supervised group of children being walked to, or from, school), or working with their local authority to promote safe cycling routes." (Guidance for full opening: schools, July 2020, https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/actions-for-schools-during-the-coronavirus-outbreak/guidance-for-full-opening-schools)

Cheshire West and Chester Council has commissioned Active Cheshire to produce this document, Active School Travel Routes, to support the school to promote active travel within your school community. Within this document, we have identified, and risk assessed 3 different routes suitable for active travel, whether that be walking, jogging, running, scootering, cycling or for wheelchair users. We have also highlighted some potential risks, uniqueness and opportunities to be more physically active on each route.

We hope that this document will help to encourage and increase sustainable active travel within your school community, improve and maintain the health and wellbeing of pupils, staff and parents/carers, reduce car usage and congestion around the school, improve air quality and increase your school's reputation as a healthy, active and environmentally friendly school.

This document is not intended to replace your existing School Travel Plan but rather to support and enhance existing provision. If you do not currently have a STP in place, this can be used as a starting point. A full STP should also consider measures and initiatives which set out how your school will use to reduce car journeys and promote other ways of getting to school safely. Successful school travel plans will be supported by the whole school community (pupils, teachers, parents, governors and support staff), the local community and the local authority.

Modeshift Stars is a useful initiative to help your school produce a STP. 



Start your day with a play on the Caughall Road playarea. Once finshed playing make your way onto Caughall Road and turn left. Once you are at Long Lane turn left and then use the traffic lights to safely cross the road and head onto Marina Drive. Turn left along Cotebrook Drive. Safely cross Weston Grove and then safely head into school.

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A Breath of Fresh Air

Cheshire West and Chester Council is committed to making sure the borough is safe and clean and part of this includes looking at ways we can tackle air pollution. The **A Breath of Fresh Air** campaign is focusing on the effects idling engines have on our environment - we're asking all drivers to switch off their engine if their vehicle is stationary to avoid contributing to unnecessary emissions.



The simple rule is: if you're parked, please switch off your engine.

Vehicle emissions are the most significant source of air pollution in the borough and it is associated with a number of adverse health impacts. Additionally, air pollution particularly affects the most vulnerable in society, including children and older people, and those with heart and lung conditions. Children are particularly vulnerable to the air pollution created by idling vehicles for several reasons: they breathe faster than adults, take in 50% more air per pound of body weight, and are simply closer to the ground and the exhaust pipes of vehicles. Therefore, roads around schools will be actively targeted for enforcement action.

Your school can support this important by spreading the words within your school community. This is also a great opportunity to support the health and wellbeing of your school community by encouraging and promoting active travel within your school community to further help to tackle air pollution issue. A simple but effective solution could be "why not try parking a little further away, at one of the highlighted parking areas in this document and travel actively for the remainder of the journey into school?"
